



Protecting your LGBTQ Child's Rights



LGBTQ individuals, relationships, families, and topics can be discussed or referenced in schools, but can't be a part of classroom lesson plans;



Schools must be responsive to anti-LGBTQ bullying;



GSAs (Gay-Straight Alliances) are able to form in any secondary schools that allow other non-curricular clubs;



Books with LGBTQ characters and stories are allowed in our school libraries;



Students are able to dress in a manner that is affirming to their gender identity, so long as their clothing still abides by the school district's dress code:



Parents can request to have their child's affirmed name and affirmed pronouns utilized, and teachers are allowed to honor that request;



LGBTQ faculty and staff can't be fired because of their sexual orientation or gender identity;



"Safe Space" or rainbow stickers, posters, lanyards, pins, buttons, etc. are permitted in schools and classrooms;



Schools may have single-user, unisex restrooms available to any student; and



Parents have the right to protect their family's privacy, and have the right to decide who knows about their child's sexual orientation or gender identity.
